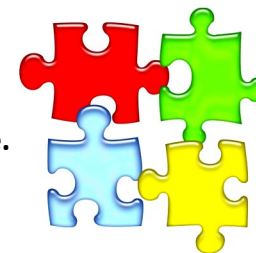

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY INTO CHURCH BUILDINGS

- 1) People recently arrived in Australia from overseas, have been in contact with anyone recently arrived in Australia from overseas or with anyone diagnosed with Covid-19, or are feeling ill, even mildly, are not to enter church buildings until having successfully self-isolated as per current Government requirements - as these are updated. If you are a parishioner, please advise Revd Oliver, Ann, Sylvia, Noelene, Martin or Julie so that appropriate support can be offered.
- 2) If possible, parishioners who have been diagnosed with Covid-19 are asked to advise or have someone advise Revd Oliver, Ann, Sylvia, Noelene, Martin or Julie so that appropriate steps can be taken within the parish and support can be offered.
- 3) People who are considered most at risk (those over 70 years, have weakened immune systems, asthma, respiratory conditions, and those with pre-existing medical problems such as high blood pressure, heart problems or diabetes) or anyone who feels they could be at risk are encouraged not to enter church buildings. If you do self-isolate please advise Revd Oliver, Ann, Sylvia, Noelene, Martin or Julie so appropriate support can be offered.
- 4) When entering and exiting church buildings people are required to use hand sanitiser, keep a distance of 4sq metres from each other as per Government requirements, and follow instructions on signage in and on buildings in relation to hygiene.
- 5) Tables, chairs, toilets, taps and any other equipment is to be washed down using hot, soapy water after use.
