Planning a wedding

Congratulations on your decision to be married. We look forward to working with you to make this a truly memorable and special occasion. We invite you to consider one of our historic churches for your special day - Church of the Epiphany Mundaring or Church of St Francis Wooroloo.

We are happy to meet with you to discuss your specific needs and any questions you may have.

Wedding preparation

We encourage you to engage in marriage preparation either with our Rector or one of the many organisations that offer these programs. If our Rector is to carry out the marriage ceremony, they will work with you as you prepare for your day.

If there is another Anglican priest you would like to carry officiate we will offer them the full hospitality of the parish.

Wedding service

Our Rector or other Anglican priest of your choice presides at the wedding service, which is taken directly from *A Prayer Book*



Booking the church of choice

You will need to talk to the Rector or contact the Parish Office to ensure the church is available on the day you have chosen and make a booking.

Marriage and Baptism

It is a requirement for at least one of you to have been Baptised in a Christian Church. We will need to view your baptism Card/Certificate.

Documentation under The Marriage Act

The Marriage Act requires the priest who is to carry out the marriage to see your Birth Certificates before the ceremony takes place.

If you are a widow or widower the priest must see the Death Certificate of the deceased spouse.

If you are divorced the priest will need to seek permission from the Bishop to enable the wedding to proceed and must see the divorced person(s) *Decree Nisi*.

The Notice of Intended Marriage must be given to the celebrating priest one month and one day prior to the marriage ceremony.

Flowers

You can provide flowers for the service. If you do not provide flowers, we can organise flowers to be in the Sanctuary behind the altar.

Fees and charges

There is no fee for the wedding service or for the time and services of the Rector. We do encourage you to make a thank you offering directly to the Rector that will be used for the ongoing ministry of the church.

A basic fee of \$250 will normally be charged to cover the cost of flowers, preparing and cleaning the church for your day and attending to logistical details for the Rector and during the service.

Payment may be by cash, cheque, money order or direct deposit. Our Parish Office will assist you in organising your payment.

Music

You can organise a musician and have use of our organ or piano. If not, we may be able to organise a musician on your behalf, who may charge a fee.

Service sheet

If you are unable to organise a wedding service sheet or would like us to organise one, we can do this. If you have any special requests in how this is done we will do our best to accommodate them.

Photographs

Please discuss photographic requirements with the Rector to ensure you obtain a record of your day without disturbing the ceremony.
