The Church of The Epiphany

Long before Mundaring became a parish and after the township of Mundaring was declared in 1898, Anglicans worshipped at various temporary sites in the area. Growth in population made it imperative to have a permanent building in which services could be held, and to an acre of land in Mann Street was granted by the government on a 999 year lease.

Local Mundaring residents raised money to build the Church and a loan was secured from the Diocese for the balance. The whole of the stone required for the building was donated, with the total cost of the building being £605.

The foundation stone was laid on 27 June 1914 by Mr W T Loton, who was presented with a commemorative wooden Stonemason's Mallet. In 2017 the Mallet was gifted to the parish by one of his descendants and is on display in the Parish Centre.

Epiphany was consecrated on 14 November 1914. The Church has been renovated and restored, both inside and out. Epiphany has remained a place of worship in the Hills community for all of her 107 years and she remains a Church of the people, built by the people.
